On 6-21-2014 at 0052 hours, I was dispatched to 10615 124<sup>th</sup> Ave NE for the report of a female who was "going crazy and hitting people." The call originally went through to Washington State Patrol dispatch and was transferred to Norcom dispatch. When Norcom picked up the call, they only had an open line. A call back to the number went to a voicemail to a [REDACTED]

Officer Carlson and Sergeant Goguen were the first units on scene. Upon arrival, Officer Carlson advised that he heard loud shouting from the South, in the direction of [REDACTED] Ave. Sergeant Goguen then advised that a female came outside.

When I arrived, I entered the residence and observed Officer Pierce speaking with a male and a female who were later identified as Teresa and [REDACTED] in what I later learned was the family's rec-room. They both appeared to be crying and I observed that [REDACTED] t-shirt was ripped and that his face had red marks on it. I first checked on Sergeant Goguen and Officer Carlson. Sergeant Goguen was with a female, later identified as Hope A. Stevens (7-30-1981), in the kitchen and Officer Carlson was in the living room with Jeffery Obert who was the husband of Teresa and the father of [REDACTED]. I spoke with [REDACTED] away from his mother. I observed that [REDACTED] nose and left jawbone area were red. His t-shirt was torn on the left side from underarm area to the bottom seam. He had a bleeding cut on the bottom of his left ear, just above the earlobe. His arms were bright red and had scratch marks on it. He was crying and stated that "we just let her back into our lives." He further explained that she "always does this."

[REDACTED] stated that he was home tonight with his mother, father and other relatives. He said that his mom's half-sister, Hope Stevens came over upset about the fact that her husband, Jeremy, refused to take her to catch a flight because he was being a jerk. [REDACTED] said she appeared to have been drinking when she arrived, but she and [REDACTED] mother, Teresa L. Obert (12-10-1971) continued drinking wine together and that Hope drank "a lot" of wine. The other family members eventually left and Hope and Teresa continued drinking wine.

At some point, Hope became upset with [REDACTED] because she thought he was speaking ill of her. [REDACTED] said that he was actually talking about Jackie Onassis and how she had married into a bad family, and tried to explain that to Hope. Later, they were discussing plays that [REDACTED] performs in, and [REDACTED] mentioned how he believes in order to be a good actor, you have to have an "athletic state of mind." Hope told him he would never be athletic, that he was too fat and overweight and crazy to ever be an athlete. [REDACTED] said he has an anxiety disorder and this is why Hope called him crazy. [REDACTED] said that this upset her and he told her to get her "c[REDACTED] face" out of his house.

██████████ was so upset by this interaction that he went into the rec room of his house in order to get away from Hope. Hope followed him out there to confront him and he called for his mother. Hope then called him a “pussy” for calling his mom to help and then called him crazy again. ██████████ told her that he thought her family and particularly her father were the crazy ones. ██████████ went on to explain how his mother and Hope are actually half-sisters and that Hope's father had two other families. This seemed to upset her and she “charged” ██████████ and took a swing at him with a closed fist and “lightly connected” with his face. He pushed her down to the ground and she immediately got back up and came at ██████████ and repeatedly punched him in the face and tackled him. He grabbed her by the hair, took her to the ground and held her there until she calmed down. He said when she appeared calm, he let her go and she immediately grabbed his hair pulled his head down and started punching him in the face repeatedly.

At this point, Teresa said she came in and tried to pull Hope off of ██████████ and then Hope punched Teresa in the face several times. ██████████ then tried to pull Hope off of Teresa and eventually got a wooden broom that he “broke over her head” to get her to stop assaulting Teresa. She still would not stop so ██████████ got an old gun that did not work (ultimately determined to be a broken bb gun) and pointed it at her in an attempt to get her to leave and stop assaulting ██████████ and Teresa. He said that Hope did stop, but would not leave and kept “circling like a shark.” ██████████ called 911 and Teresa said that she was eventually able to push Hope out the door. Shortly after, Hope walked around the side of the house, jumped over the fence into their yard and re-entered the house through an unlocked sliding door and started accusing Teresa of purposely hiding her cell phone. Teresa told her she would find it and leave it outside for her, and then Hope started attacking Teresa by pulling her to the ground and continuing to strike her in the face.

By this time, ██████████ said he had already put the gun away because he believed Hope had left and would stay gone. This time ██████████ said he grabbed an aluminum mop because the wooden broom had been previously ineffective in stopping Hope from assaulting his mother. ██████████ planned to strike her with it to prevent Hope from attacking his mother any further, which is about when the first police units arrived and he did not use the mop on Hope.

After speaking with ██████████ I observed that Teresa had a swollen left cheekbone that was already starting to get a purplish hue to it in the cheekbone area. Teresa was highly emotional throughout our contact with her and kept hugging ██████████ and asking him if he was ok. She also apologized to ██████████ for letting Hope back into their lives and told us several times that ██████████ wanted nothing to do with Hope and did not want her in the house at all.

Sergeant Goguen spoke with Hope, who advised him that she did not assault or touch anyone, but had been struck in the head with a broomstick by ██████████ after she called him fat and unathletic. Sergeant Goguen said that he did not observe any visible injuries and Hope would not allow him to inspect her head for injuries. Hope A. Stevens (7-30-1981) was arrested for two counts of DV Assault 4 (RCW 9A.36.041) and transported to the Kirkland Jail by Officer

Ouimet, who advised her of her Miranda rights. She declined to give a written statement at the station.

After Hope was removed from the residence, I took a written statement from [REDACTED]. While taking the statement, Jeffery kept telling [REDACTED] that he should not talk to us and that this should all be kept in the family. [REDACTED] said he was sick of Hope always getting away with everything and he was going to provide a statement. Jeffery continued to try to convince [REDACTED] not to provide a statement. At one point, Jeffery told [REDACTED] to get the dogs and take them to bed with him. [REDACTED] said he would do it after he gave a statement. After I wrote the statement, [REDACTED] made a few corrections to my statement that corrected the order in which a couple of events took place. These corrections were added to the end of the statement and signed by [REDACTED].

After obtaining a statement, I took photographs of [REDACTED] and his injuries. Jeffery stated that he did not give me consent to take photographs, but again, [REDACTED] stated that he wanted me to take pictures and that he would testify in court if needed to do so, because he is tired of Hope getting away with everything. The photos were taken with Officer Pierce's camera and were uploaded into KPD records by Officer Pierce.

Officer Pierce also submitted the 911 tape request form to Norcom on my behalf and provided me with a copy of the written statement he obtained from Teresa. All of these documents were submitted to KPD records. I also completed a temporary no contact order form for Teresa and [REDACTED] and e-mailed them to Judge Lambo.

This is the extent of my involvement in this case.

**Sgt Goguen

On 06/21/14 at about 0053 hrs, I was dispatched to a reported disturbance call that had been transferred from Washington State Patrol. Dispatch advised they were on the telephone with a male caller who stated there was a "female going crazy and hitting people." Dispatch provided an address of [REDACTED] NE for the location of the disturbance.

I arrived on scene at 0058 hrs and parked north of the address. The residence is a one story single family home located on the corner of a cul-de-sac. The front door faces east towards [REDACTED] NE and is completely enclosed by a 6 ft cedar fence. The garage, which has been converted into a recreational room, faces north and has an access door to and from the driveway.

As I approached the residence on foot, I observed the exterior light above the garage door turn on followed by the door opening and a female screaming. I could not see from my vantage point who the female was, but was able to make out what she was saying, "get out of my house!" I was later able to determine that female was Teresa L. Obert [REDACTED]. Officer Carlson had arrived and parked south of the residence and was on foot when he heard the yelling and advised radio.

I met up with Officer Carlson at the edge of the driveway. I could clearly hear multiple voices coming from inside the residence that appeared in distress. I walked towards the door, which had glass panes on the upper portion and could see the head of a male moving around in front of the door. The male, later identified as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was yelling at someone inside to "get out of the house!" I knocked on the door and [REDACTED] immediately opened the door and stated, "good the police are hear, come in and get her out of our house!" [REDACTED] had two halves of a stick or broom handle in his hands along with a metal pole. I ordered [REDACTED] to put the items down and he complied.

I stepped inside and was met by a highly agitated and emotional Teresa Obert. Teresa and [REDACTED] both showed signs of fatigue or exhaustion. Their faces were flush and beads of sweat were visible on or about their faces. Teresa repeatedly screamed out loud while pointing towards the kitchen area of the house that her sister had attacked her son and had punched her (Teresa) in the face when she tried to intervene. [REDACTED] was very animated and insistent that "Hope" attacked him and his mother and needed to leave the house.

Other officers arrived on scene and began to talk with Teresa and [REDACTED]. Myself and Officer Carlson walked up a short stack of stairs into the kitchen where a female, whom I immediately recognized as Hope Solo and later identified as Hope A. Stevens (07/30/81), was standing near an adult male, later identified as Jeffrey A. Obert (01/16/61). Stevens was calm, but visibly upset. Her eyes were red and bloodshot. I asked Stevens to please have a seat so I could discuss with her what had transpired.

I asked Stevens to explain to me what had happened. Stevens stated that she had

come over to her sister's house to visit and got into an argument with her nephew. Stevens told me [REDACTED] is an actor and into the arts. During a conversation with [REDACTED] Stevens made the comment that [REDACTED] was not an athlete. She accused him of being overweight, which upset [REDACTED]. Stevens began to cry as she told me how her sister always protects [REDACTED]. When Stevens spoke, her speech was slurred and I could smell the odor of intoxicating liquor on her breath.

While talking with Stevens, I could hear both [REDACTED] and Teresa discussing with officers how Stevens had attacked and punched both of them repeatedly. I also heard Teresa mention [REDACTED] had struck Stevens with a stick in an attempt to get her away from her (Teresa).

I asked Stevens if the argument had escalated to physical contact. Stevens looked away from me and began to cry. Stevens then pulled her legs up into her chest and grabbed the top of her head saying her head hurt. I asked her what happened to her head and Stevens told me [REDACTED] had struck her with a stick. When I asked what precipitated [REDACTED] striking her in the head, Stevens did not answer. She continued to cry and told me that [REDACTED] was a scary person and she was protecting herself. I asked Stevens if she had any bumps or cuts as a result of being struck in the head. She shrugged her shoulders. I asked if I could take a look and Stevens adamantly declined. I did not observe any other obvious signs of injuries to Stevens.

It was apparent to me Stevens was unwilling to go into detail of what exactly happened. Each time I asked her if she had physically pushed or struck either Teresa or [REDACTED] Stevens would shake her head no and attempt to change the subject. When Stevens was asked why her sister and nephew were telling officers they had been attacked and punched by Stevens, she would simply state, "I did not hit anyone. He hit me with a stick."

After about 10 minutes of give and take, Stevens, demeanor changed and she became more demanding. Trying to take over the scene/ interview. Stevens asked if she could talk to her sister so she can make everything right. When I told her she could not talk to her sister at this moment, Stevens became agitated and suggested she had a "right to talk to her sister." Stevens made several demands for me to allow her to talk to her sister. Each time her demand was denied.

I asked Officer Ouimet if he would remain with Stevens so I could consult with Officer(s) Pierce and Voss. I walked into the game room and shared with them what Stevens had told me. Officer Pierce indicated that based on his interview of Teresa, her obvious injuries and Officer Voss' interview of [REDACTED] and his obvious injuries, he had probable cause to arrest Stevens for two counts of Assault-DV 4th degree.

I walked back into the kitchen and advised Stevens that she was under arrest for Assault-DV and placed her into handcuffs. Stevens became very upset, questioning why she was being arrested. Once in handcuffs, I advised her of her right to remain silent and her right to an attorney and proceeded to escort her out of the house. Stevens continued to ask what she was being arrested for claiming she was the victim. I informed her on multiple occasions that she was being arrested for

assaulting her sister and nephew. Stevens denied she had hit anyone.

Stevens was placed into the back of Officer Ouimet's vehicle for transport. Officer Ouimet transported Stevens to KPD for processing.

I responded to the station and completed a criminal citation for two accounts of Assault-DV 4th degree and provided a copy to corrections. I then made contact with Stevens and asked if she would like to provide a written statement regarding tonight's events. Initially, Stevens smiled and stated, "sure." Then almost immediately she told me, "actually, no. I want to talk to my attorney." I acknowledged her request and told her corrections would handle that request. I began to walk away, when Corporal Russell called out to me that Stevens is unwilling to provide the name of her attorney to them, but would give it to me. I returned to the fingerprinting room and asked Stevens what the name is of her attorney. Stevens told me her attorney's name is Todd Maybrown. I asked her to confirm the spelling on the last name and she told me that she did not know who to spell his last name. When asked if the attorney was local, Stevens did not answer repeating, "I want to talk to my attorney." I Googled the subjects name and found the attorney out of Seattle. I recorded the phone number and provided it to corrections. I told Stevens if after talking with her attorney if she wished to provide a statement she could inform corrections and they will let me know. I was later told Stevens told corrections she did not wish to speak with me.

This concluded my involvement with this case.

While on patrol assigned as 3K7 on 06-21-14 at 0052 hours I was requested via NORCOM to respond to [REDACTED] Ave NE on report of a disturbance. NORCOM related that they had received a call transferred from WSP of a female going crazy and hitting people. I then responded from 11100 block of 120th Ave NE.

Upon my arrival I parked on [REDACTED] NE and walked to the house addressed as [REDACTED] Ave NE. The house is a one story home that faces towards the east on the west side of [REDACTED] NE at NE 106th Street. There is a six foot, gated, wooden fence that surrounds most of the property. There is an entrance in what appeared to be a converted garage. This door faces towards NE 106th Street. As I walked towards the home I could heard a female yelling.

I followed Sgt. Goguen and Officer Carlson into the residence.

Once inside the residence I contacted a female who identified herself as Obert, Teresa L. and a male who identified himself as [REDACTED]. Teresa said that [REDACTED] was her son.

Both mother and son appeared upset and distraught. Teresa kept saying that [REDACTED] was only trying to protect her and asking if he was in trouble. Teresa's clothing was in disarray and [REDACTED] t-shirt was torn on the left side. Teresa appeared that she could not stand and had bruising on the left side of her face. She also had a large scratch on the right side of her neck. Teresa complained that her jaw was dislocated. The son [REDACTED] had what looked like finger marks on his left upper arm. He was also bleeding from his left ear. [REDACTED] said that his nose had been bleeding but that it had now stopped bleeding.

The room I entered was a convert garage with a concrete floor. The room appeared to have been used to store items for the family.

Teresa related that she, her son and another family member had gone out to dinner tonight and when they returned home she saw her sisters SUV parked in front of her house. Teresa said that her sister Hope Solo was in the vehicle and appeared to be crying. Teresa said that her sister told her that she had missed her flight because she was supposed to have a game tomorrow and that her husband had left her for the night.

Teresa said that she had been estranged from her sister for some time now. Teresa said that she asked Solo/Stevens to come into her house and relax. Teresa said that when her sister came into the house she (Teresa) poured her sister a couple glasses of wine. Teresa kept saying that she (meaning herself) does not drink that much.

Teresa said that she did not know what happened but that her sister told her son [REDACTED] that he was fat and bi-polar, bat shit crazy. Teresa said that her son told Solo/ Stevens that her father was also over weight.

Teresa said that she went to the bathroom and when she went back to the room where her son and Solo/Stevens were at, that she found Solo/Stevens was hitting her son in the head. Her son was on the floor and Solo/Stevens was then on top of her son hitting him in the head. Teresa said that she then tried to pull her sister off of her son and that her sister then started hitting her in the face several times. I asked Teresa if her sister was using a closed fist and she said yes.

Teresa could not relate how but she found herself on the floor with her sister on top of her hitting her in the head. Teresa said that her son was then trying to pull Solo/Stevens off of her. Teresa said that her son had hit Solo/Stevens in the head with a broom handle to get his aunt off of her but did not want to put that in this written statement.

Teresa said that she and her son were telling Solo/Stevens to leave the house and that her son pointed the stock of a broken BB-gun at Solo/Stevens. Teresa said that she then pushed her sister out of the door.

Teresa said that after they closed the door her sister jumped over the fence that surrounds the property and came back into the house through another door. Teresa said that her sister was asking for her cell phone and other stuff and that her son then called 911. Teresa said that the police were then knocking on the door.

Teresa kept pointing to the left side of her face saying that this is where her sister had punched her. There was swelling to the left side of her face and a scratch on the top of her cheek. As I wrote the statement for Teresa she sat on the concrete floor the entire time. After I wrote the statement Teresa said that she was too upset to read the statement so I read the statement to her, She made changes as I read the statement too her then she signed the statement which consisted of two pages.

The son [REDACTED], [REDACTED] verbally related to me when I first contacted him that his aunt Hope Solo had come over tonight and that everyone appeared to be having a good time listening to records and that his aunt then started telling him that he was not an athlete and that he was fat. [REDACTED] said that he told his aunt that actors are also like athletes and when he told his aunt that her father was also over weight she then started hitting him in the head with her fists.

[REDACTED] said that when he was on the floor and his aunt was on top of him hitting him in the head his mother tried to pull her sister off of him and that his aunt then started hitting his mother in the face and head. [REDACTED] said that at one point he got a broom stick and broke it over his aunt's head because he feared for his mother's safety.

Sgt. Goguen who had been with the other involved party in the living room he came to the doorway and asked me what I had. I then informed him that there was probable cause to arrest Solo/Steven for assault 4th DV.

Officer Voss took a written statement from the son [REDACTED]

I then took digital photos of Teresa and [REDACTED] and their injuries. These photos were down loaded into this case file.

I then completed medical releases for both Teresa and [REDACTED] and had asked Teresa to read and sign both releases as her son is a minor.

I then provided Teresa with my business card which included the case number for this incident. These medical releases are included with this case file.

I asked Teresa several times if she wished any medical treatment for her injuries but she refused.

This is a supplemental case to the original case being submitted by Officer Voss.

Porter Supplement**

On 06/22/2014, the victim in this case Teresa Obert advised dispatch that she wanted to speak to a supervisor that was on duty. I called her at approximately 1100 hours, and the first thing that she told me was that she didn't know what to do. She was asking questions in a very rapid manner about the need for hiring an attorney, talking to the defense investigator and assertions made by the defense attorney through the media. I had earlier assigned Officer Mades the task of making contact with both victims for follow up photos, and asked her if I could come to her residence to speak to her in person.

I met with both victims. [REDACTED] had easily visible marks on his arms and both sides of his face. Teresa's left cheekbone was swollen and starting to bruise. There was an abrasion on her neck near her adam's apple. I did not see any marks on her arms. Teresa was still very upset and nervous which was obvious by her visibly shaking.

Teresa's biggest concern was that she had seen in the media reports of the arrestee, Hope Solo, in this case being the actual victim. She was afraid that Solo's attorney or whomever was "going to go after" [REDACTED] by saying he was the one that should have been arrested. I explained to her very briefly the criminal trial process to include both the prosecution and defense presenting their respective cases. Teresa had also told me that several people had recommended that she retain an attorney. I reminded her that both she and [REDACTED] are the victims in this case, but consulting an attorney wouldn't hurt. Teresa was also very clearly afraid of Solo both literally and from a legal aspect. She told me that with the recent assault combined with some past events made her feel that Solo is a real physical threat to her family. I explained the no contact order process to her and that if Solo abides by the order, she has nothing to fear. I did advise her that if a long term order is put in place at Solo's first appearance, that Teresa needs to notify the police immediately if any type of contact is made to include that from a third party.

When we first sat down, Teresa mentioned an incident that had happened around December 28th of last year. She told me that after teaching a yoga class, she checked her phone and saw that there were three missed calls from Solo. When she called her, Solo told Teresa that she had an argument with her husband, Jerramy Stevens and was upset. Teresa went to the house on [REDACTED] E that Solo owns because she was there to turn the keys over to a renter. Teresa told me that when she arrived, she could tell that Solo had been drinking, and saw that she had a four pack of small wine bottles. The initial appointment with the renter was for 1300 hours that day, but Solo told Teresa that Solo's husband had changed the appointment to 1400 hours. Teresa took Solo to the PCC Market for lunch. Solo did not have her phone with her because Stevens had either taken it from her or broken it, according to Teresa. When they were on the way back to the house, Solo was going through Teresa's text messages and found one to their brother Marcus. Teresa told me that Marcus and Solo had not spoken since the incident at Solo's house in November of 2012 (KPD case 2012-56111). Teresa told me that she had been in contact with Marcus in an attempt to help repair his relationship with Solo.

When Solo saw those texts, she became very angry and began screaming and striking the car seat that Teresa was sitting in. At this point, they were in the driveway to Solo's home. Solo got out of the car, and feigned throwing Teresa's cell phone. She apparently had simply dropped it in the muddy driveway as that was where Teresa found it later. Teresa told me that all of her work contacts were on that phone, and that she needed it for her business. She looked for it briefly in the yard, but then approached Solo's house as she was inside it with the new renter. Teresa asked the third person if she could use her phone to call her own in an attempt to locate it. She stated that Solo told the third party that she didn't need to do that, and stepped out of the house closing the door behind her. Teresa told me that Solo told her to get off her property. When Teresa told Solo that she needed her phone for the aforementioned reasons, Solo told her again that "...you need to leave my property, bitch...". Teresa told me that she responded by telling Solo that she was a "bully". Solo's response to that was allegedly "...say that to me one more time and I'll punch you in the face...". I asked her what she thought when Solo said that to her. Teresa told me "I thought that if I didn't leave, Hope was going to hurt me." Teresa went on to tell me that for the next two days, Solo sent her numerous texts that were mean and hurtful. It got to the point that Teresa blocked Solo's number from her phone so that she couldn't call or text. I did ask Teresa if I could get copies of those texts, but she told me that she wasn't willing to turn them over to me at that point because she was afraid of making Solo angrier. She did tell me that if it became necessary, she would give them to me.

Teresa told me that she did not see Solo after the incident in December until May of 2014 when they met for sushi. During this meeting, Teresa said that Solo apologized for everything. She also told me that she thought that they were starting their relationship over. They saw each other several times between May and the recent incident without any issues whatsoever. Teresa said that they came home after dinner on Friday night and Solo was sitting in front of their house in her vehicle. Teresa told me that she had told ██████████ that Solo was having a rough night and just needed a hug. She stated that Solo's rough night was because of another argument with Stevens. He allegedly was supposed to take her to the airport to fly out of town for a game, but he didn't. When Solo first went inside Teresa's, she notified her team that she had missed the plane, and purchased another ticket for a different flight. Teresa told me that she her first impression upon seeing Solo was that she was intoxicated. Things were fine for the next couple of hours before the assault occurred.

When I had Teresa review her statement and sign it, I could see that her hands were still shaking from her nervousness. I had been at the residence for approximately three hours at that point.

Teresa also mentioned to me that she and ██████████ had gone to the Immediate Clinic-Rose Hill to be evaluated after the incident. The only thing worth noting from that visit was the doctor told Teresa that there was a possibility that her cheekbone was fractured during the assault. This would have to be confirmed with a CT scan, but Teresa told me that she could not afford that at the moment. As I mentioned, the swelling was obvious in that area. Teresa also told me that it was difficult to eat and swallow due to the pain.
